Upon successfully passing the NCLEX-RN and meeting the requirements of the Georgia Board of Nursing, graduates are granted licensure to practice nursing in the state of Georgia as registered nurses. Program graduates receive an Associate of Science (ASN) degree. Graduates are then eligible to apply and take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). |
| Barbering for Cosmetologists (BF21) | Georgia | | Upon program completion, students have two choices: (1) Students may take the Georgia licensing exam and after receiving licensure apply to the Board in their home state for reciprocity (OR) (2) complete the program in Georgia and submit a written request to the Board of their home state asking permission to take the licensing exam in that state. |
