#### SCTC Administrators Participate in Leadership Development

Four top administrators from Southern Crescent Technical College recently participated in prestigious leadership training programs, further enhancing the college's ability to serve students and the community. Each program focused on key aspects of higher education leadership, preparing participants to address the unique challenges and opportunities in their respective roles.

Dr. Xenia Johns, Vice President for Student Affairs, participated in the highly-acclaimed American Association of Community Colleges Future President Institute in Washington, D.C. which provided in-depth training on governance, leadership, fiscal planning and resource development, student success, and the importance of partnerships for senior leaders aspiring to become community college presidents and for those seeking to become more engaged leaders in their own college. The program brought together leaders from across the nation to discuss issues and collaborate on innovative solutions to challenges faced in higher education.

Under the direction of SCTC Nursing faculty, each year student nurses have assisted with the SCPA pickleball tournaments by volunteering in the first-aid tent. sctech.edu/Pickleball accelerated and streamlined pathway for Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) and Paramedics to earn their Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) and become eligible to sit for the NCLEX-RN state board exams to become official Registered Nurses (RN). The program combines rigorous academic coursework with hands-on clinical training, ensuring graduates are well-prepared to deliver exceptional patient care in a variety of healthcare settings. It consists of three semesters, enabling participants to complete their RN education in just one year.

"I am deeply honored to celebrate the first graduating class of the LPN/Paramedic to RN Bridge cohort at Southern Crescent Technical College," said Kim Register, SCTC Vice President for Academic Affairs. Their hard work, resilience, and passion for advancing their careers in nursing are a testament to their commitment to making a difference in healthcare and beyond. This milestone not only reflects their personal achievements but also reinforces our mission to equip students with the skills and knowledge to transform lives and serve our communities."

The RN Bridge program provides upward mobility for students seeking career development. Graduates of the first cohort have already begun securing more advanced roles in local hospitals, clinics, and long-term care facilities, contributing to the region's healthcare workforce and addressing a growing demand for skilled nursing professionals. Erin Jones, SCTC Nursing Department Chair said, "The inaugural pinning ceremony honors this special group of student nurses, recognizing their dedication and achievements as they step into the future of nursing. This milestone symbolizes a pivotal step in addressing healthcare needs and marks the expansion of opportunities for aspiring nurses. We have recently announced plans to expand the RN Bridge program in the coming year and are extremely excited to further strengthen the profession."

SCTC's Adult Education classes assist students with College and Career Readiness, Adult Basic Education, Georgia High School Equivalency Exam Preparation (such as a GED or HiSET, Career Plus diplomas) Integrated Education and Training (IETs), job placement, college enrollment, basic life skills, digital literacy, citizenship, and English Language Learning. Individuals ages 16 and older are eligible to enroll in the Adult Education program. Instruction includes individualized assignments, small group and large group instruction and activities, and online components in order to maximize learning opportunities. An array of class times, days and locations allow students to attend classes without sacrificing job, family, and other commitments. All instruction, books, and materials are free of charge.
